Acquired Brain Injury Training Package

Connect Case Management (ccm.) deliver training workshops which aim to develop the knowledge of Acquired Brain Injury (ABI) for those working in the disability sector, particularly care providers looking to upskill their staff.

During the training, our qualified facilitator will demonstrate effective techniques that enable attendees to better engage with their clients, develop their skills, and understand behaviours.

This 3 hour course will develop the attendees knowledge of ABI, awareness of how they interact with a client with an ABI, and how they can use effective prompting techniques to avoid escalation of the client's behaviour.

Duration: 1 x 3 hour session

Delivery: Face to face delivery with online resources available to participants.



Course Outline:

SECTION 1

- Definition, statistics and causes of ABI.
- Introduction to brain anatomy relating to ABI.
- Education about common impairments experienced by those with an ABI.

SECTION 2:

- Introduction of the Hierarchy of Prompting and its importance when delivering care.
- Practical kinaesthetic exercises relating to one or more of the following:
 - Physical impairment.
 - Visual impairment.
 - Cognitive impairment.
 - Psychological impairment.
 - Importance of prompting correctly to support the client effectively.
- Education about the importance of effective documentation.
- Provision of standardised documentation templates with legends specific for prompting, and for ease of shift reporting.

SECTION 3:

- Potential video vignettes/case studies for participants to observe a client and then complete documentation to effectively record type of prompting used.
- Address triggers for behaviour escalation, and raise awareness of the participant being a trigger themselves, thus the importance for prompting and understanding the client's preferences.
- 15 minutes question time.
- Feedback form for participants to complete regarding the relevance and delivery of the training session –post session.
